WYFI is a health information exchange (HIE) being implemented for providers and stakeholders within and surrounding the state of Wyoming. WYFI is working toward the vision of creating community-based virtual medical records and other clinical applications to promote a healthier Wyoming through a statewide secure, connected and coordinated health IT system. The term length is from June 20, 2018, to June 20, 2019.
